Katherine will discuss OHA's ScreenWise transformation, which works to integrate cardiovascular disease screening and family histories into breast and cervical cancer screenings. She also works with providers to make it a program that integrates easily into a variety of practices.

Genevieve leads Healthy Columbia Willamette Collaborative, a group of 7 hospital systems, 2 Medicaid organizations, and 4 county health departments from Clackamas, Clark, Multnomah, and Washington counties. HCWC organizations come together to conduct regional community health needs assessments and identify areas for collaboration to improve community health.
